Feeding Pennsylvania!

Food insecurity now impacts nearly 1 in 6 American families and the impact of COVID-19 on the economy has only served to increase the magnitude of the problem. Many people donate to food banks and the like during the holiday season, but there is frequently a steep drop-off in donations during the winter months. In Pennsylvania, 1,401,920 people are struggling with hunger - and of them 399,270 are children.



Consequently, PASR is hoping to help as many people as possible meet their nutritional needs. PASR has partnered with Feeding Pennsylvania, a non-profit that works with food banks across PA and that has excellent ratings from many charity rating organizations—90% of donations go towards feeding those in need, which is a higher amount than most charities. Our own Second Harvest Food Bank is a member of Feeding Pennsylvania, so donations will be felt locally. Additionally, Feeding Pennsylvania also works with PA farmers to supply fresh produce and dairy products. So, this presents a win-win-win situation in so far as our efforts can benefit those facing food insecurity here in PA, our efforts will benefit small PA family farms, and PASR members will rest a bit easier knowing that they have once again helped those in need.

We are asking every PASR member to join us in this crucial cause by making a donation to "Feeding Pennsylvania" in February 2021. Any amount will help!

Donations can be made in two ways:

- 1. In February (and ONLY IN FEBRUARY!!) we ask you to visit the Feeding Pennsylvania website (https://feedingpa.org/) and make a donation online. In FEBRUARY ONLYthere will be an option on the website to indicate that the donation is being made as part of the PASR effort. (PASR Headquarters will also be sending out an email blast to state members in January about Feeding Pennsylvania).
- 2. Those who do not wish to donate online can make a check payable to "Feeding Pennsylvania" in February and mail it to PASR, 878 Century Dr., Mechanicsburg, PA 17055.

Thank you for joining PASR in this worthy cause; and more importantly for helping needy families all across Pennsylvania get the food they so desperately need!



Don't Be Scammed!

Every day Pennsylvanian's receive many calls and emails that are scams. Where can you turn to for help if you suspect a scam or become victim of a scam? PASR State Headquarters has provided the following information to assist us with this serious problem.

The PA Attorney General's Office and the Department of Senior Protection have a number of great resources, including a Senior Safety Tips Brochure that includes useful information on what seniors can do to help keep themselves safe. You can find the Attorney General's Office online at www.attorneygeneral.gov/protect-yourself/seniors? etm=1483275. Seniors can also reach the Department of Senior Protection by calling the toll-free helpline at 1-866-623-2137 or emailing seniors@attorneygeneral.gov.

Another resource for seniors on the Attorney General's website is the Health Care Section which helps keep Pennsylvanians aware of things like deceptive medical practices, medical record access, and information about what to do if coverage is denied or handling billing disputes. This department can be reached by calling 1-877-888-4877 or by emailing healthcare@attorneygeneral.gov.

Another resource is the PA Senior Law Center, www.seniorlawcenter.org, which offers a free and confidential statewide HelpLine service for PA seniors (60 years and older) to connect with an attorney to receive legal information, advice, and/or referrals as well as brief services for certain areas of law.
